Introduction

This survey was fielded online from November 6-27, 2024. The sample size is 2,880 AAPI registered voters who indicated that they voted in the 2024 US presidential election. The survey was fielded to collect both a national sample (1,096 respondents) and an oversample of respondents residing in seven battleground states (1,784 respondents).

The unweighted sample size in each of the battleground states is: AZ (272); GA (324); MI (271); NV (378); NC (251); PA (343); WI (131). This yields a total battleground state sample of 1,970.

Margin-of-error for the national sample is $\pm 2.96\%$ (with 0.95 confidence). Margin-of-error for the pooled results of residents of the seven battleground states is $\pm 2.21\%$ (with 0.95 confidence).

The sample was recruited through Cint's Lucid Marketplace, employing quota sampling to maximize representativeness. Respondent-level weights were calculate and applied to account for observable sample imbalance on age, gender, and census region (or state of residence for those results where the sample is restricted to the seven battleground states).

Experimental conditions

BASELINE CONDITION

Some people believe the United States should have the following policy:

Mass deportation of millions of undocumented immigrants.

LONG-TERM RESIDENTS CONDITION

Some people believe the United States should have the following policy:

Mass deportation of millions of undocumented immigrants.

- Such a policy would include people who have lived in the United States for decades, payed taxes, and built lives for themselves and their families.
- Many of these people have spouses and children who are American citizens, but they cannot get citizenship themselves.

FAMILY SEPARATION CONDITION

Some people believe the United States should have the following policy:

Mass deportation of millions of undocumented immigrants.

- A policy of mass deportation will rip American families apart.
- We've seen the terrible effects of family separation in previous years, and no one wants to go back to that.
- Many undocumented people have children or spouses who are US citizens, and a policy of deportation would separate these parents from their children.

ECONOMY CONDITION

Some people believe the United States should have the following policy:

Mass deportation of millions of undocumented immigrants.

- A policy of mass deportation will be an economic disaster for the US, and cause our economy to shrink by nearly 6%, a loss of \$1.6 trillion. The policy would also cause prices to rise all across our economy, leading to devastating inflation.
- Deporting millions of people will lead to labor shortages and price increases, with food being left to rot in the fields with no one to pick it, and making it even harder to build an affordable home.
- On top of that, mass deportation will cost more than \$400 billion, adding to our national debt.

WRONGFUL DEPORTATION CONDITION

Some people believe the United States should have the following policy:

Mass deportation of millions of undocumented immigrants.

- A policy of mass deportation will lead to raids on homes and workplaces, and even people who are in the country legally are at-risk.
- As law enforcement looks for people who should be deported, they'll require detailed documentation. Even if someone is in the country legally, they could be wrongfully deported if their old documents are lost, misplaced, or damaged.
